

Update on our Strategic Plan

1. Promote COMMUNITY Development Initiatives - The Economic Development Task Force continues to implement and identify new initiatives and has been successful. Focus is on future accommodations, Dark Sky Preserve, Four Seasons Scenic Route, trails, and a trail head has been established in Ompah.
2. Implement a Communication Plan – Staff have had professional training and have implemented a Facebook page and established a Twitter account.
3. Establish Collaborative working relationships with Government Bodies – has been initiated with Council members assigned to Provincial Ministries. This one is slow going and needs more work.
4. Enhance and Sustain our Asset Management Plans to ensure long term sustainability – will be updating the plan to include Building Condition Assessments and smaller infrastructure items not included in the past such as smaller culverts as an example.

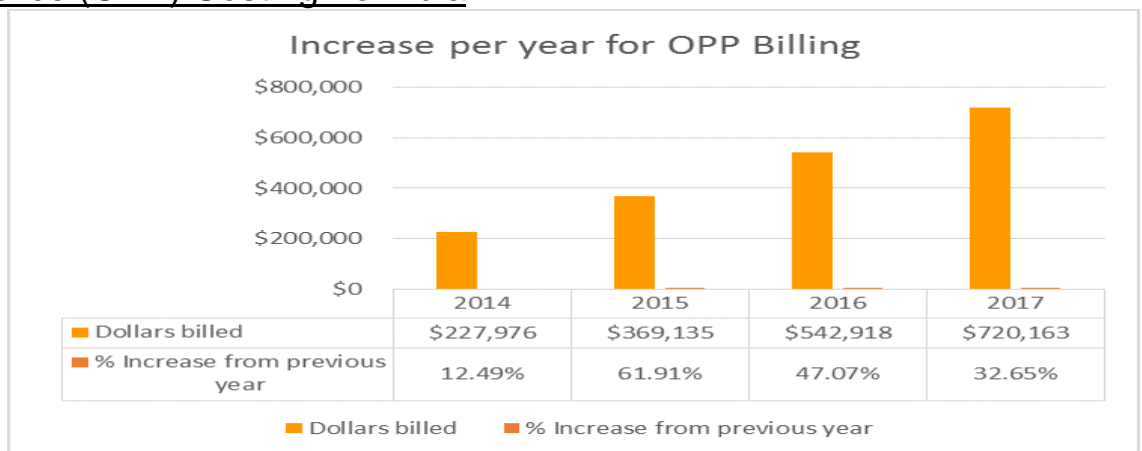
The Community Policing Advisory Committee has vastly improved the relationships with our OPP detachments and has seen an increased visibility and enforcement.

Our Official Plan (OP) is near finalization and is expected to have a final approval in September which will see the implementation of what we feel is a best in class OP in the Province. It will allow us to attract new investment and residents with a forward way of thinking to accommodate new housing and business trends and maintain continued compliance with regulations.

I am always amazed at the number of volunteers we have in the community and the amount of work they do. This includes our Volunteer Firefighters and Committee Volunteers as well as Community Volunteers who have assisted with grants for Community Hall improvements and hosting a number of events. 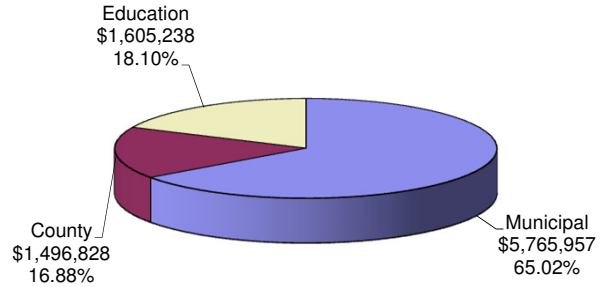

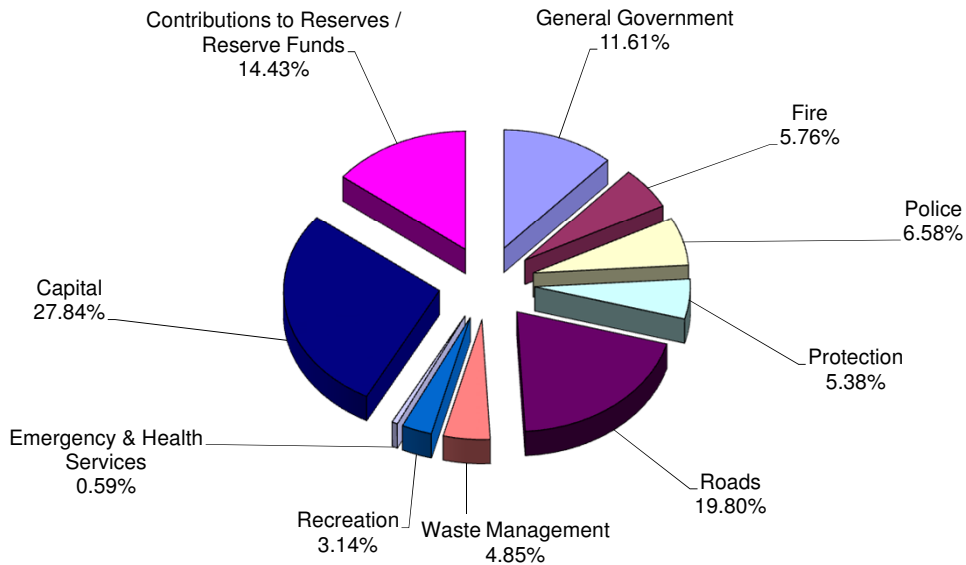

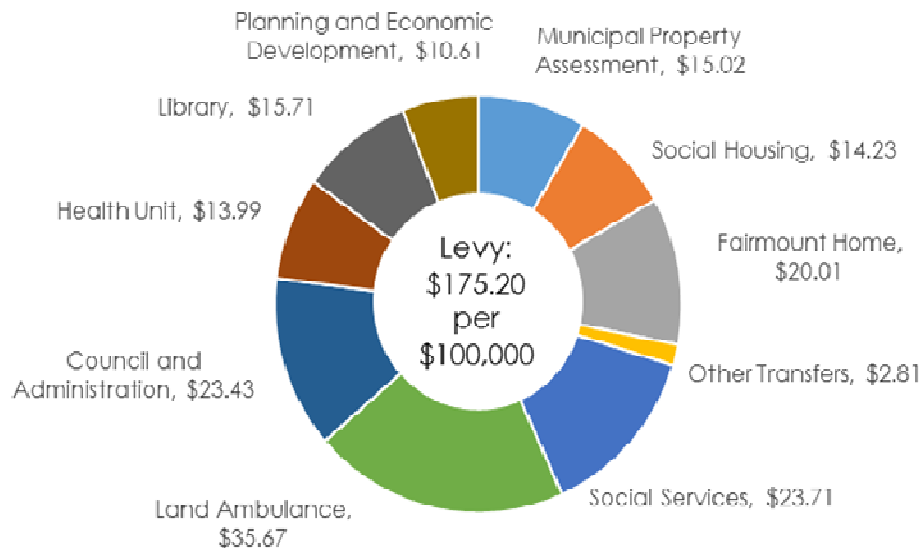
2017 DISTRIBUTION OF TAXATION DOLLARS
