

NOTES OF A MEETING OF THE NORTH FRONTENAC CENOTAPH TASK FORCE HELD ON JUNE 5TH, 2013 AT 6:00 PM AT THE CLAR MILL FIRE HALL UPSTAIRS MEETING ROOM.

Present: Councillor Gerry Martin (Chair), Councillor Wayne Good, Eileen Flieler, Bob Kenney and Corey Klatt – Manager of Community Development (MCD).

Absent with Regrets: Mayor Bud Clayton and Cor Bakelaar.

6:00 pm – Meeting called to order.

Members of the group reviewed the proposal and price quotation for a monument which was received by W&R Stone Carvers. It was suggested that a red poppy and a maple leaf (as shown on W&R Stone Carvers Website) be added to the centre portion of the monument for perusal. It was also suggested that the English wording on the monument be on the left side of the monument and the French version be on the right side of the monument. Lastly, it was recommended that the engraved wolves in the bottom corners of the monument be removed and the engraved wolf at the top centre of the monument remain as proposed.

The Manager of Community Development (MCD) will attempt to obtain two more proposals and price quotations for the group to peruse for Council consideration. The MCD will also look into pricing for stone benches.

Councillor Martin will work at draft drawings for the Cenotaph Site which will include the base.

The MCD will discuss the Cenotaph project with the North Frontenac Public Works Manager to determine whether or not the Public Works Department could assist with site preparation and costs for them to assist.

Councillor Martin will discuss the War Monument idea with Ed Schlievert (President of the Clar Mill Community Volunteers) to see if the Clar Mill Community Volunteers would be interested in assisting with a financial donation to the project and/or future upkeep of the Cenotaph.

Councillor Good will discuss this project with Terry Good (Orange Lodge and Black Lodge) to see if they would be interested in donating to this project.

In the future it may be beneficial to approach the Cloyne Gardening Club to enquire as to whether or not they would be interested in planting and maintaining shrubbery, etc... within the project site.

Once all cost estimates are received the Task Force will ask Council for consideration to apply to the Community War Memorial Program for up to 50% of the funding for this project.

The next meeting of the North Frontenac Cenotaph Task Force will take place on Tuesday July 2nd, at 1:00 pm at the Clarendon Miller Fire Hall Upstairs Meeting Room.
